I. Call to Order

V. Public Hearing

A. Proposed amendments to Section 10.3 Accessory Apartments

Z. Maderia opened the public hearing for proposed amendments to Section 10.3 Accessory Apartments. He noted that the abutting towns were notified. The town of Lisbon Planning & Zoning Commission sent a letter stating the amendments would have no inter-municipal impacts. There were no other comments or input from the public. C. A. Meeting Dates 2023- The Commission accepted the meeting dates for 2023.

M. Gil stated that the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation agreeable to the Commission and the Board of Selectmen's concern regarding the new maintenance building on Route 14. M. Gil stated they agreed to a brick building, a shallow pitched roof, limited lighting, a retaining wall, and landscaping along the roadside of the building. The DOT would submit a new design for the town to review. The Commission discussed recent complaints regarding ATV activity close to abutting property lines that occurs at all times of the day and night. The members suggested M. Gil bring this to Attorney Branse for

recommendations on how best to address this issue. The members stated they did not wish to infringe on owners' rights to utilize their own property but felt this could be done while being respectful to abutters.
